

#### a message from senior pastor, Jacob Heine

Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy.

Exodus 20:8

**What does this mean?** We should fear and love God so that we do not despise preaching and His Word, but hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it.

Every organization needs to have Core Values that help guide and direct decisions and all that they do. Faith Lutheran Church is no different. We have our Core Values that help to guide and direct all that we do and the decisions we make. Last month I started highlighting these values and why they matter to us. We heard how we are to put Christ at the center of all things. Christ is our light and our salvation, and it is important to put Him first in all things.

This month we look at our 2<sup>nd</sup> Core Value.

#### Core Value # 2 - Meaningful Worship

We know that worship is important. As early as Genesis 4 we see that Cain and Able brought sacrifices to God in the act of worship. This importance of worship continues throughout Scripture all the way until Revelation 22 where the throne of God is there with the Lamb of God, Jesus Christ, seated upon it, being worshipped by all His servants. From start to finish, worship is shown as being important. This is the time when God's people would gather together to receive from God His gifts, as well as to thank and praise Him for the gifts that He gives. During the week we pour ourselves out in service to our neighbor. When we come to worship we come together for God to pour himself out to fill us up through His Son, Jesus Christ.

What matters in worship isn't style or preference. Rather what matters is that God comes to us and that we, together as one body – the Church, thank and praise Him for this. Although we confess that God is present everywhere, we are not promised to meet God everywhere. We may. We may not. However, in worship, in the proclamation of God's Word and in the receiving of His gifts in the Sacraments God, has promised to be there. We know that we will meet God in worship.

We certainly have our preferences and desires. This isn't necessarily a bad thing. God has made each of us different. This is a great thing. This is why we offer worship in different forms. It is in these forms that God meets us. He doesn't bind himself to one way, but promises to be present in worship. This is why worship style has shifted and adapted since the beginning of time. What matters is that God's Word is proclaimed, that forgiveness and grace are given and received, and that the sacraments are regularly administered.

This also means that we have to ask questions about styles and formats that will bring God's Word and gifts to those that aren't currently here. It is truly good, right, and appropriate that we have worship for those that are present and part of the congregation now. It is also important that we also ask what forms and styles of worship will reach those that are not currently present. We want all people to hear God's word and come to salvation in Christ our Lord.

With a grant from Thrivent, we assembled 40 personal hygiene kits in mesh bags that included shampoo, conditioner, body wash, body lotion, and a bath sponge with a personal note of encouragement using cards from Faith's Care Card Ministry to be given to the YWCA's Center for Safety and Empowerment battered women's shelter. We also have collected donations of urgently needed household items for them.

Our speaker for the Tea (provided by Eve Circle) was Melanie Hutchison. She shared some amazing stories from her 12 years in India, living in villages, cities and slums. Melanie set-up Training Centers and taught sewing skills to women rescued from the streets - enabling them to earn money to support themselves and their children. Hannah Circle hosted the Tea with a wonderful selection of fall breads.

## Update from our treasurer. . .

#### MONTHLY FINANCIAL RESULTS

- Donations for September were \$87,247 and expenses were \$73,697 resulting in a <u>net positive</u> balance for the month of \$13,551.
- YTD Donations are \$786,233 and expenses are \$840,603 resulting in a net YTD <u>negative</u> balance of (\$54,380).
- September YTD donations are \$31,869 below 2022.
- YTD expenses of \$126,076 are below budget.
