

a message from senior pastor, Jacob Heine

Having purified your souls by your obedience to the truth for a sincere brotherly love, love one another earnestly from a pure heart, since you have been born again, not of perishable seed but of imperishable, through the living and abiding word of God;

1 Peter 1:22 - 23

Every organization needs to have Core Values that help guide and direct decisions and all that they do. Faith Lutheran Church is no different. We have our Core Values that help to guide and direct all that we do and the decisions we make. Several months ago I started highlighting these values and why they matter to us. We heard how we are to put Christ at the center of all things. Christ is our light and our salvation, and it is important to put Him first in all things. We have heard about the importance of worship, about how we need to hear God's Word proclaimed and receive His Sacraments. We have heard the importance of Christian Education and the need to continue to learn and grow in God's Word. We have heard how God has a mission, and church to fulfill that mission.

This month we look at our 5th Core Value.

Core Value #5 - Congregation Care

In baptism God has made us into His family. Each of us are brothers and sisters in and with Christ, having been adopted into the family of God by water and Word. This is a key piece of our theology. It guides much of what we do as a congregation. With Christ as our head, we gather for worship, in a form of a family reunion that takes place weekly, and sometimes more frequently. As God's people we gather around the Word of God to study and grow in faith together. God sends us out on mission to bring more brothers and sisters into the family.

Families take care of each other. This is a key understanding from the beginning of the Bible, when we hear God remind Cain that he is his brother's keeper, to the very end when we look forward to the Kingdom of God, surrounded by our brothers and sisters in faith in a world that has no end.

God gives us pastors, DCEs, and other workers in the church to help us in this task, but they are not called to do it all for us. Just as our workers take time to talk with, visit, and spend time with our members at all times of life, God also calls each of us to do the same thing. Each member is called to look out for, care for, and show concern for each other.

If someone used to sit in the same pew, or around you on Sunday morning, and you haven't seen them in some time, pick up the phone, send a text, reach out and let them know you miss them. If there was someone you serve with and you know that they have been ill, send a note or offer to make a meal and drop it off. We don't need to wait for a program or organized drive to show care for each other. God has called us to love each other earnestly from the pure heart He has given us through baptism.

FOR YOUR HEALTH ... The Gift of our Miraculous Body

February is American Heart Month, and Friday, February 2, is National Wear Red Day. The first American Heart Month was proclaimed by President Lyndon Johnson in February of 1964. National Wear Red Day is celebrated on the first Friday of February. It was established by the National Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute to raise awareness of heart disease...the most lethal disease in the United States and around the world.

Heart disease, which includes several specific diseases, is the leading cause of death for men, women, and people of most racial and ethnic groups in the United States. Coronary Artery Disease (CAD) is the most common type of heart disease and is the major cause of heart attacks. Statistics from the CDC show that one in twenty adults ages 20 and older have some degree of CAD. This is surprising to me. After pondering this statistic, I would say that CAD is a disease process that, for the most part, develops over time rather than "going from zero to sixty in a heartbeat." A person who develops CAD and has a heart attack often says, "I am in good health. I don't have any health problems." That is an understandable thought, as we most often don't have symptoms and therefore don't realize that we do have a health problem as a coronary artery is being narrowed by plaque. Our first sign of a health problem that puts us at risk of having a heart attack is sometimes the heart attack itself. Other sobering statistics include:

In the United States someone has a heart attack every 40 seconds

In the United States someone dies due to cardiovascular disease every 33 seconds





Oxygen is a very important component of the heart's work in our bodies. Body cells use oxygen to do many things. Oxygen in our blood, carried by hemoglobin, allows cells to perform vital functions in our bodies, such as powering muscles. The muscles in our legs use oxygen as we walk, run, and move. The involuntary muscles in our body, like the heart, use oxygen to perform their job. The heart is vital in the process of blood flow, which supplies all our muscles with oxygen. Hemoglobin, or red blood cells, in our blood receive oxygen as they pass through the lungs; the oxygen binds to the hemoglobin, and the heart circulates the oxygenated blood to cells (muscles, organs, the brain) throughout the body as you breathe and your heart beats. On a molecular level, oxygen powers the movement of substances into and out of cells, like potassium, sodium, etc., which make the cells work. All of this activity is necessary for the life of our cells, which includes our organs' and body's life!

Our bodies are an intricate mass of organs, molecules, fluids, masses, etc. It's amazing to think how it all works together. There can be no doubt that we have an awesome God. The complexity of our human body is simply amazing. We are told in Genesis 2:7 "The Lord God formed the man from the dust of the ground and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life, and the man became a living being." Jeremiah 1:5 says, "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you." Praise be to our wonderful, loving God!

There are multiple diseases, or diagnoses, related to the human heart. We will look at different types of heart disease over the next few months, including coronary artery disease, cardiac arrhythmias, different types of heart failure and cardiomyopathy, and heart valve diseases.

Do not use this information to diagnose yourself or a loved one. Any time you think you might have a heart problem I encourage you to contact your physician or go to the Emergency Room for evaluation.

MONTHLY FINANCIAL RESULTS

- Donations for December were \$165,147 and expenses were \$92,225 resulting in a **net positive** balance for the month of \$72,922.
- YTD Donations are \$1,135,467 and expenses are \$1,117,685 resulting in a net YTD <u>positive</u> balance of \$17,782.
- December donations were \$29,515 <u>higher</u> than 2022 and YTD donations are \$1,071 higher than 2022.
