

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### a message from senior pastor, Jacob Heine

"For no one can lay any foundation other than what has been laid down. That foundation is Jesus Christ." ~1 Corinthians 3:11~

Our Church is built on Christ alone. That is the heart of Lutheran Theology – Saved by grace through faith in Jesus Christ alone. It is what we build our mission and ministry upon. Christ is what we need and all we need. Everything we do and all that we are starts here. It is the solid foundation of our teaching and our practice. Christ is all and in all.

Foundations are important because when we build on a solid foundation we can withstand storms, challenges, and issues that come up in. Like a building with a solid foundation can weather a storm, churches with solid foundations can withstand hardship and danger with a solid theological foundation.

Our theological foundation of Christ is the most important thing. However, our physical building foundation is also important. Over the last 75 years we have built buildings as a place for God's people to gather for worship and activities, for learning and growing in the mission and ministry of God in this place. We have added on and have updated our facilities in many ways. And in many ways, we need to continue this work. The literal floor of our facilities is in need to replacing. Many tiles are cracked and some our falling apart. There are some places that are becoming hazards and others that will be soon.

At our May Voters' Meeting we announced that we needed to undertake a Capital Improvement Campaign to cover the cost of this important project. To replace all the tiled areas in the building with durable flooring will cost approximately \$130,000. By replacing the flooring in all these areas we will continue to have a safe and attractive building to proclaim our true solid foundation of Jesus Christ.

We are asking that you would prayerfully consider how much you can contribute to the **Solid Foundation Capital Improvement Campaign**. We know that it is through all of us working together and giving sacrificially that we can make this project happen. We will only begin this project when we have half of the cost already covered (\$66,488.40 cash on hand).

We know that God provides in many and various ways. Your presence and support through finances and prayer are just a couple of those ways that God has made Faith Lutheran an amazing congregation! We know that we have a faith built on the **Solid Foundation** of Christ, and through our facilities we get to continue to Grow in that faith to Share Christ's love!

### MONTHLY FINANCIAL RESULTS

- Donations for April were \$99,941 and expenses were \$81,335 resulting in a **net positive** balance for the month of \$17,606.
- Year to date donations are \$424,744 and expenses were \$366,293 resulting in a year to date balance of \$58,451.
- Donation for April were \$4,122 lower than April 2023.
- Year to date donations are \$49,541 above 2023.

### The Beat Goes On.......Heart Valve Disorders

This article on the heart will be focused on heart valve disease. Heart valves, when working properly, keep the blood moving through the body, in the right direction. Heart valves open only one way and only when they need to open. For the best body function heart valves must open all the way and close tightly to prevent leakage.

There are four valves in the heart. They are the aortic valve, tricuspid valve, pulmonary valve, and mitral valve. Electrical impulses in your heart cause the blood to flow through these valves in a synchronized manner.

Aortic valve stenosis is a thickening and, thus, narrowing of the valve, which passes blood from the heart's main pumping chamber, the left ventricle, to the body's main artery, the aorta. This condition results in reduced blood flow from the heart to the rest of the body. It is important to remember that this is the oxygen-rich blood that is distributed to all parts of the body to fuel a person's organs and cells to perform their specific work, which makes the body function properly. A person can be born with aortic valve disease (congenital heart defect) or the disease may occur later in life related to other health conditions, such as hypertension, infection, injury to the heart, strep throat, endocarditis, or radiation therapy to the chest.

**Endocarditis**, a type of heart valve disease, is an infection that is usually caused by bacteria throughout the body. The bacteria enters the blood, which then spreads the bacteria throughout the body as the blood is pumped through the body. If the bacteria settles in the heart, a person will have endocarditis, which can be life threatening if not treated. Sources of the bacteria can be caused by an illness or surgery or after intravenous drug use. If



diagnosed soon enough antibiotics can usually cure the infection.

Another common heart valve disease is **Rheumatic heart disease**. This condition develops when the heart muscle and valves are damaged by rheumatic fever, which is linked to untreated strep throat and scarlet fever. Because doctors now treat strep throat and scarlet fever with antibiotics, rheumatic heart disease is less prevalent today than it was years ago. If strep throat or scarlet fever were left untreated the symptoms of **Rheumatic heart disease** usually show up many years after the infection.

Basically, the heart valves keep the blood in the body moving in the right direction, at the right time, completely emptying each chamber of the heart as the blood is passed to the receiving organ or chamber in the heart, and closing tightly after opening and pumping blood out so as to avoid any blood leaking out when the valve is closed. When heart valves do not work properly they can sometimes be repaired or they can be replaced. Replacement valves can be mechanical (man-made) valves or they can be tissue valves, which are created from animal donors' heart valves. Discussions relating to which type of replacement valve would be best for each individual case based on the patient's age, medical history, and other considerations presented by the cardiovascular surgeon.

It is my hope that this series of heart-related articles has been helpful to you in gaining a basic understanding of how the heart works. Again, however, do not use this information to diagnose yourself or a loved one. Any time you think you might have a heart problem I encourage you to contact your physician or go to the Emergency Room for evaluation. The human body does not survive long without a good heartbeat.


