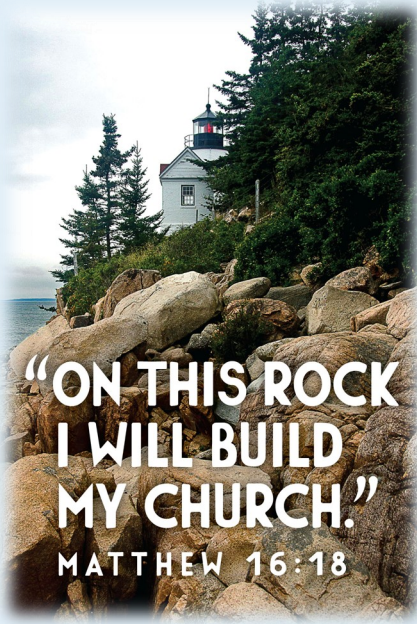

a message from senior pastor, Jacob Heine

The last several months I have had the joy of walking through years of bulletins, Weekend Updates, Messengers, and other church records getting ready for the celebration of Faith's 75th Anniversary. It has been enlightening to read through these documents and see the joys of new members, new pastors and DCEs, years when building projects happened and mortgage burnings were granted. There were years of surplus budgets and attendance that pushed 600 people per Sunday.

There have also been the years of struggle and hardship. Articles that have noted the deaths of prominent and well-loved members, the departure of pastors and DCEs to other places, the closing of a daycare and the end of a Saturday night service. There are lean years in giving when there needed to be appeals for the members to give more to cover the budget and so employees could be paid, and where attendance declined.

There have been ups and there have been downs.

But there is one constant that has been there through it all. Christ, the Rock of the Church and our solid foundation.

This year is no different. 2023 is a year of some wonderful moments for us as a congregation. We are celebrating 75 years of making disciples in Topeka. This year we called Hannah Elsey as our second DCE and Jeff Lane will ready to be ordained early in 2024. Our leadership has worked on cleaning up our constitution and bylaws, worked on the Board Policy Manual, and are dreaming about the future of the congregation. We have seen visitors nearly every week (many returning week after week) and new members being welcomed in. There are great things to celebrate this year.

And we have our challenges. Giving has been down this year. Though we are currently making our budget obligation, you have probably noticed in previous Messengers that we have also run a deficit several months. Our facilities have

- Donations for March were \$109,557 and expenses were \$109,989 resulting in a **Negative** balance for the month of \$(5,432).
- YTD Donations are \$272,140 and expenses are \$280,734 resulting in a net YTD negative balance of (\$8,594).

JOURNEY TO JERUSALEM

From our Parish Nurse Wrap-up

As a congregation we departed from our nativity scene on January 15 and traveled to St. Louis where we saw the LCMS Seminary and Synod Offices, then a little further south to Perry County, Missouri, where many German Lutheran immigrants settled in the 1790's, impacting the LCMS as we know it today. Our next stop was the Port of New Orleans, where many of these and other German Lutherans entered the United States. Right here in the United States' midwest we are so close to so much history.

Along the journey we visited Ireland, Scotland, England, Germany, Greece...seven cities in Greece where Paul had preached the good news of Jesus, Italy, Spain, and Ethiopia before arriving in Jerusalem, the site of Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection. Here in Topeka we ended our Journey at the Cross for Easter services and celebration. We hope this Journey has been meaningful and memorable for you!

When we started planning this Journey we looked at the 6,614 miles from Topeka to Jerusalem...the most direct, "as the bird flies" route, with hope that we would arrive in Jerusalem before Easter. We had 12 weeks to achieve this goal of 6,614 miles. Truly we felt this Journey was a huge undertaking. However, after our first week of the Journey we had walked 1,866 miles, thanks to so many dedicated participants! That took us back to the world map to discuss some sightseeing options. Thank you to Pastor Heine who routed us through so many Bibically-rich places!

Our final tally of miles journeyed is **22,806 miles**, which is 45,612,000 steps! Just for fun let us share some stats. We had 125 congregational members signed up to participate in this Journey. Twenty-eight of those 125 did not turn in activity, and we had 13 participants who had not signed up but contributed steps/miles, making a total of 110 participants who turned in activity! We thank each and every participant for the steps and miles you turned in...making this Journey and our memories so valuable!!

Our hope is that the physical activity has been meaningful to you, and that you continue to be active and aware of your activity. In addition to the benefits of the physical activity we hope you experienced some spiritual highs during our Journey and that your memories include them too!

We would love to hear some feedback about the Journey. Would you do this type of journey again? If yes, is there anything that you think could be done differently? What did you enjoy, or what was your favorite part of the Journey? What did you not like? Did you use the weekly devotions? Did you enjoy the information on the places we visited? Any comments you have would be very much appreciated! You can call, text, or email any one of us. We would love to hear your thoughts!

I want to extend a heart-felt thank you to my partners in planning this Journey, Jacki Theis and Jennifer Steere-Offerman. We had some fun, spent lots of time researching places (and learning a lot), and sharing the joys and deadlines of keeping up with the many aspects of our Journey!

We hope you continue to stay active in your life...physically, spiritually, and in your community...and keep making memories!
