a message from senior pastor, Jacob Heine

Jesus said, "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come on you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." Acts 1:8

Every organization needs to have Core Values that help guide and direct decisions and all that they do. Faith Lutheran Church is no different. We have our Core Values that help to guide and direct all that we do and the decisions we make. A couple of months ago I started highlighting these values and why they matter to us. We heard how we are to put Christ at the center of all things. Christ is our light and our salvation, and it is important to put Him first in all things. We have heard about the importance of worship, about how we need to hear God's Word proclaimed and receive His Sacraments. We have heard the importance of Christian Education and the need to continue to learn and grow in God's Word.

This month we look at our 4th Core Value.

Core Value #4 - Mission Outreach

When Christ ascended back to the right hand of the Father, He left specific instructions for His followers. Those instructions are often summarized like this: Be disciples who make disciples. We do this by baptizing and teaching (which are two of our other Core Values, Worship and Education). We also do this by being Christ's witnesses. A witness is one who has seen an event and can provide evidence of that event. In other words, as disciples we have seen the goodness of God in Christ Jesus, and we provide evidence of that to others as we live in this world.

We believe that this is what God has called us to do regardless of who you are or your stage in life. Children are able to talk about the love of Jesus as they play with other kids and do activities. Teenagers act as witnesses of God when they take the time to pray before tests or meals at school. Adult provide evidence of God as they tell others about how God provided for them and their families when they least expected it. And Senior's late in life take time to pass down their beliefs and faith to the next generation as they share their stories of their lives in Christ.

This Core Value is so important to Faith, and to the church as a whole, that when presented with the opportunity to call a DCE for Mission and Outreach we jumped. We know that there are many projects, trips, and prospects we can work on as a congregation that having someone to help guide us and lead us in those endeavors was not something we could pass by. We look forward with expectations for the educational classes that will be presented on how to share our faith and live as disciples every day. We wait with eager anticipation for the local mission projects we will be able to join in as well as the national and international trips that will stretch us and provide chances for us to grow in faith.

Being disciples living on mission at home and to the ends of the earth is something that God calls all His children to. The world is ripe and ready for harvest. It is an exciting time in history to be a disciple of Christ!

What a wonderful time it was to be in worship during the Advent and Christmas! This past month, Faith members and friends were able to experience glorious music and worship, including our beautiful Christmas Concert in mid-December, the contemplative Wednesday evening Advent services, the four Christmas Eve services that offered worship styles for everyone, and the other Sunday and holiday services all giving glory and honor and praise to the Newborn King! But now what? As we move through the Epiphany season and soon to Lent, music in worship still happens! So, if you would like to be an active participant in Faith's Music Ministry, now's the time to join one of these groups...

- Adult Choir This SATB choir sings in both styles of Sunday worship services, fall thru spring, Music selections include classic sacred music, gospel, multicultural and traditional favorites. No auditions needed. Rehearsals are Thursdays, 7:15pm in the balcony choir loft, beginning Jan. 4.
- Praise Team & Band leads the modern (contemporary) worship every Sunday. Vocalists are scheduled to sing 1-2 times per month; the band members (keyboard, guitars, bass, drums) often rotate weeks according to their schedules. Interested in singing or playing? Simply come to a rehearsal on Wednesdays at 7:30pm in the sanctuary and see what happens.
- Alleluia Ringers Handbell Choir offers music usually once a month in all worship services and other special services. Knowledge of reading music is required, but new ringers will be trained. Open to high school youth and adults by audition (substitutes are also needed). Rehearsals are Thursdays at 6:00pm beginning Jan 4.
- Ensembles, solos, instrumentalists We always are looking for special music to enhance worship with vocal or instrumental pieces. And sometimes we need an instrument such as flute, oboe, brass, strings, etc, to add to a choral piece or hymn.

FOR YOUR HEALTH ... Seasonal Affective Disorder a message from our Parish Nurse Pat

Happy New Year to all!

The days are shorter at this time of the year and the nights are longer, and consequently it is common for some people to suffer with Seasonal Affective Disorder, or SAD. Although much less common, SAD can occur in the spring and summer. Winter's shorter days with less sunlight can trigger a chemical change in the brain which triggers the symptoms of SAD. Melatonin is a hormone that our brain produces in response to darkness, and melatonin contributes to sleepiness. Therefore, more darkness can make a person feel more sleepy or lethargic. It is important to know that depression is different from occasionally feeling sad or unhappy, and depression cannot be willed away.

Common symptoms of SAD include: increased sleep time and daytime sleepiness; loss of interest and pleasure in activities you usually enjoy; social withdrawal and increased sensitivity to rejection; irritability and anxiety; feelings of guilt and hopelessness; fatigue and feelings of low energy; decreased ability to focus or concentrate; difficulty in clear thinking; increased appetite, especially for sweets and/or carbs; and some physical problems, such as headache. A SAD diagnosis should be made by a medical professional.



Treatment for SAD can include: exposure to sunlight by being outside, or by sitting next to a window with sun streaming through, even on a cloudy day; light therapy, a special light for a specific amount of time every day; psychotherapy...cognitive, behavioral, or interpersonal therapy that helps change the distorted views you may have of yourself and the environment around you; and antidepressants to help correct the chemical imbalance that can lead to SAD.

There are also some things a person with SAD can do to help themself, such as to set realistic goals; to refrain from taking on too many projects or activities; to break large tasks into small ones; to set priorities; to spend time with other people; to confide in someone related to your feelings; to do things that make you feel better; to get regular exercise; to stay away from alcohol and drugs, as they can make depression worse; and to let your friends and family help you.

Always remember that it is best to contact your care provider for assistance and advice if you feel you might be suffering with SAD. Don't blow it off or tell yourself you can "get through it." Life is too short to spend days struggling with negative feelings. Reach out for help so you can enjoy the days our gracious Lord has given you on this earth. And enjoy!

By year-end Doorstep spent over \$54,600 on food purchases, and the need has remained at an increased level.

In the weeks preceding the Super Bowl, February 11, Doorstep asks member congregations to collect soup, all varieties, and crackers to help stock the food shelves. A really successful event

Please remember Doorstep when grocery shopping, and pick up a couple of cans of soup for our neighbors in need. All donations can be brought to church and left in the Doorstep box in the Gathering

Nook.

MONTHLY FINANCIAL RESULTS

- Donations for November were \$101,562 and expenses were \$93,875 resulting in a **net positive** balance for the month of \$7,687.
- YTD Donations are \$970,320 and expenses are \$1,025,460 resulting in a net YTD <u>negative</u> balance of (\$55,141).
- November donations were \$24,487 <u>higher</u> than 2022 and YTD donations are (\$28,444) <u>below</u> 2022.
