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### a message from senior pastor, Jacob Heine

"Whatever you do, do it from the heart, as something done for the Lord and not for people, knowing that you will receive the reward of an inheritance from the Lord. You serve the Lord Christ." Colossians 3:23 – 24

Considering a call is stressful for everyone. For the congregation issuing a call, they have been without a worker for some time. They have been working to figure out how to keep ministry going all while looking for the right person to fill the position that they have vacant. There are meetings and conversations, interviews and visits, and lots and lots of prayer. All while having the unknown of how long this process is going to last.

For the congregation where the worker is called from, it is always a shock when they learn that someone they love and have worked with might be leaving them. In all of this, we keep the words of St. Paul in mind: We work for God...we serve the Lord Christ. This is because the Lord Christ worked for us first. In His life, death, and resurrection Christ showed us His great love. He showed us His great work for us. The work of redemption and salvation.

Because of this, each of us follows and serves the Lord Christ. We do so out of gratitude and thanksgiving for what He has done for us. It doesn't necessarily make the stress and anxiety go away. But it does give us a focus and someone to turn to when the stress and anxiety arrive.

Making the decision to remain at my call here at Faith was a good reminder for all of us, I hope, that Christ is Lord and we follow Him. Through prayer and conversation we know that there is work to do together, as His people, serving the Lord Christ. My continued prayer is that we keep the Lord Christ in front of us and serve Him. I believe the best is yet to come for Faith.

July is the 7<sup>th</sup> month of our calendar year. In the Bible the number 7 holds great significance and symbolic meaning. It is the number that represents completion, perfection, and divine fulfillment. The number 7 appears in Genesis where God creates the world in six days and rests on the seventh day, calling it the Sabbath. This established the pattern of a 7-day week. It sets a divine order and completeness in the world, and it signifies the perfect work of God and His control over all things.

Again, on our calendar the 7<sup>th</sup> month is July, and July brings intense heat, and often long-awaited-for family vacations and time spent outside. Let's start with an overview of dehydration, heat exhaustion, and heat stroke. It is important to know the signs of these heat illnesses so they are recognized upon their onset!

Dehydration Symptoms include thirst, fatigue, dizziness, confusion, and dark-colored (concentrated) urine. Young children and infants may not produce tears when crying or may have sunken eyes or a dry mouth when dehydrated. If you stop sweating or aren't feeling the urge to urinate at least every two hours you are likely dehydrated. Most people think they are really drinking enough water, but most really are not. If you don't like to drink water, try adding frozen lemon, lime, or orange wedges in your water. Keep some in the freezer for quick and easy access!

Treatment for dehydration is to drink plenty of water, **at least** 60-80 ounces of water per day. Some sources say even more water is needed by most people, especially men. For a child weighing up to 100 pounds the general rule is for them to drink 50 percent of their weight in ounces of water each day. If drinking alcohol it is best to drink one extra glass of water for every alcoholic beverage you drink.

### KNOW THE SYMPTOMS



### **Heat Exhaustion**

Symptoms include rapid pulse, dizziness, fatigue, pale skin, muscle cramps, nausea, fainting, and headache. Although these symptoms are not a lot different than signs of dehydration, heat

exhaustion is more concerning than dehydration. These

symptoms should not be ignored. If you are working or playing outside it is good to replace the sodium lost from sweating by drinking electrolyte-balanced sports drinks. Drink lots of water and take breaks out of the sun. A cool, damp cloth around your neck can be helpful too.

<u>Heat Stroke</u> When the symptoms progress to heat stroke they become a medical emergency and medical attention is necessary. It is advisable to call 911. Symptoms include a body temperature of 103 or more, rapid breathing, lack of sweating, irrational behavior, and even convulsions or unresponsiveness. These symptoms can cause damage to vital organs and muscles and can be fatal.

Treatment includes stopping physical activity, seeking cool shade or shelter, removing unnecessary clothing, resting, hydrating, cooling down, and even using cold water for submersion or placing cold/ice packs under arms and in groin areas. Always remember this is a medical emergency.

<u>Swimming Accidents</u>. At the beach/in the ocean rip tides and big waves can lead to drowning. Swim where lifeguards are preset and heed all warnings about the weather or the water conditions. Learn to recognize rip tides.

At the pool avoid running which can cause falling. Always have adult supervision when children are in or near the water. Also, drinking alcohol can increase the risk of accidents in the water.

Sunburn It is advisable to apply sunscreen that blocks UVB and UVA rays, even on cloudy days. Reapply sunscreen frequently, especially if around water, concrete, or sand which reflects



the sun. Wearing lightweight clothing to cover skin when possible is also advised. Throw on a hat too, to protect your ears and neck. Sunburn affects the body's ability to cool itself, and it can lead to skin cancer later in life.

<u>Fireworks</u> Just a word about sparklers. Most people don't realize how dangerous sparklers can be. They burn at about 2000 degrees, and they can ignite clothing. Young children have received severe burns on their feet from dropping a sparkler.
