a message from senior pastor, Jacob Heine

CHRIST IS RISEN! HE IS RISEN INDEED! HALLELUJAH!

I hope that, like me, you relished in proclaiming those words again this Easter. It seemed like such a long Lenten season of fasting and subduing our worship in preparation. This Lent saw, for me and many others, sicknesses that just hung on and plagued much of what we wanted to do. And of course there is always the business of the world and the spring activities that adds to a Lent that for me, and perhaps you, was difficult.

I think that is why those words were so powerful on Easter. Words that mean victory. Words that mean hope. Words that mean new starts. Words that mean resurrection now. The Beat goes on.....again and again.....Cardiomyopathy and Heart sided heart failure. The lower your EF, the more severe your Failure

Cardiomyopathy (CM) is a disease of the myocardium, or heart muscle itself. Remember, your heart is a big muscle. When the heart muscle gets stretched, thickened, or stiff it results in a heart muscle that doesn't pump well; when the heart muscle becomes damaged, the heart's pump (of blood and oxygen) power is compromised.

Causes of cardiomyopathy can include genetic conditions, reactions to certain medications, drugs or toxins, infections from a virus (including the COVID-19 virus), one or multiple heart attacks, consistently elevated blood pressure, heart valve disorders, obesity, certain thyroid disorders, long-term consumption of alcohol, and chemotherapy. Sometimes doctors can't determine the exact cause, and the diagnosis is idiopathic CM, which simply means the cause is unknown.

Early stages of CM may not cause noticeable symptoms. As the condition worsens, however, symptoms may include dizziness, lightheadedness, and fainting; fatigue; shortness of breath during activity or at rest; shortness of breath and/or coughing when lying down or sleeping; irregular heartbeats/rapid, pounding, or fluttery feeling in the chest; an increase in weight caused by swelling in legs, ankles, feet, and in more severe cases swelling in the abdomen due to fluid accumulation; and sometimes chest pain.

Risk factors of CM can include: family history; diabetes; long-term hypertension; obesity; and excessive alcohol consumption. There is no way to avoid or change the family history you have, but all of the other risk factors can be managed to lower the risk of developing or living with cardiomyopathy.

Doctors, especially cardiologists, often assess, diagnose, and treat patients by evaluating the heart's ejection fraction (EF), which is a measurement of the amount of blood pumped out of the ventricle with each contraction. The lower the EF, the weaker the heart's pumping action. A normal EF is between 52 and 74 percent.

Mildly abnormal is between 41 and 52 percent. Moderately abnormal is between 30 and 40 percent, and severely abnormal is less than 30 percent. A low EF typically means you have or are at risk for developing heart failure. Left sided heart failure is more common than right

heart failure symptoms may be. You might experience confusion, fatigue, heart palpitations, nausea, shortness of breath at rest, or water retention in your abdomen, legs, and feet.



Cardiomyopathy and heart failure (HF) can sometimes be interchanged. Heart Failure with a reduced ejection fraction (EF) is the most common type of heart failure, and it is called Systolic Heart Failure. The left ventricle, which is the heart's main pumping chamber, weakens and cannot pump the oxygenated blood to the body effectively. This condition is also known as dilated cardiomyopathy.

Cardiomyopathy can be diagnosed with blood tests, checking how well the kidneys, thyroid, and liver are working, and a BNP, which measures a protein made in your heart; chest x-ray and echocardiogram, which shows how blood flows through your heart; cardiac stress test, which shows how your heart reacts to exercise (or stress); cardiac catheterization, which can measure how forcefully blood pumps through your heart; and cardiac CT or MRI. Treatment for cardiomyopathy typically includes medications, diet regulation and fluid restrictions, and in more severe cases supplemental oxygen.

Do not use this information to diagnose yourself or a loved one. Any time you think you might have a heart problem I encourage you to contact your physician or go to the Emergency Room for evaluation.
