



A program director and a student from Haskell LIGHT presented on their organization’s work. They support students at Haskell through Bible studies, spiritual guidance, prayer, and a variety of daily and monthly events. Their ministry provides a welcoming, safe environment where students can grow in their faith and where seeds of faith are continually being planted.

### **Annual Spring Salad Super**

Forty-seven women attended the Annual Spring Salad Supper on April 14. Deborah Circle organized the program, and Ruth Circle served as hostess.

The evening’s presentation highlighted “Project 2 Restore,” a residential, faith-based restoration home for women who have experienced the complex trauma of sex trafficking.

# Skin Cancer

a message from our Parish Nurse Pat Schultz, RN

May is National Skin Cancer Awareness Month. With summer's heat and sunshine quickly approaching, it's a good time to be mindful of how to protect our skin and reduce the risk of sun-related damage. Here is an overview of the three main types of skin cancer and steps you can take to stay safe.

## Basal Cell Carcinoma (BCC)

Basal cell carcinoma is the most common type of skin cancer—and the most common form of cancer overall. It develops in the basal cells, the lowest layer of the skin, and is usually found on areas frequently exposed to the sun. BCC often appears as a small, shiny bump or a scaly, flat patch that grows slowly over time.



Common signs of BCC include:

- A lump, bump, pimple, scab, or scaly lesion
- A growth that is translucent or ranges in color from white or pink to brown, black, or bluish
- A shiny appearance, sometimes with visible blood vessels
- Slow growth over time
- Itching or tenderness
- An open sore that may ooze or bleed

## Prevention Tips (for all skin cancers):

- Avoid sun exposure between 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.
- Avoid tanning beds and sunlamps
- Use sunscreen with SPF 30 or higher daily; reapply every two hours when outdoors, sweating, or swimming
- Wear lightweight, long-sleeved clothing, a wide-brimmed hat, and sunglasses
- Perform monthly skin self-examinations
- Schedule annual skin checks with a dermatologist
- Report any skin changes to your healthcare provider promptly

## Squamous Cell Carcinoma (SCC)

Squamous cell carcinoma is the second most common type of skin cancer. It develops in the squamous cells, which make up the outer layer of the skin. SCC occurs when these cells grow uncontrollably, often due to DNA damage caused by ultraviolet (UV) radiation from the sun or tanning devices.

Risk factors for SCC include:

- Skin that burns easily
- A history of frequent sunburns
- Previous precancerous skin lesions or skin cancer
- A weakened immune system
- Scars or chronic skin wounds

SCC can grow deeper into the skin and, in some cases, spread to other parts of the body if not treated early. Prevention measures are the same as those listed above.

## Melanoma

Melanoma is less common than BCC or SCC but is the most serious form of skin cancer due to its ability to spread quickly. It begins in melanocytes, the cells responsible for skin pigment.

Melanoma often develops from a mole or appears as a new dark spot on the skin. While most moles are harmless, any changes should be evaluated. The **ABCDE rule** can help identify warning signs:

- **A – Asymmetry:** One half does not match the other
- **B – Border:** Edges are irregular, ragged, or blurred
- **C – Color:** Uneven color or multiple shades
- **D – Diameter:** Larger than 6 mm (size of a pencil eraser)
- **E – Evolving:** Changes in size, shape, color, or elevation

In addition, any mole that itches, bleeds, or looks different from others should be checked by a healthcare professional.

## In Summary

The most important step in reducing your risk of skin cancer is prevention. Consistent sun protection, monthly self-exams, and annual professional skin evaluations are key to early detection and successful treatment. Stay skin-safe while enjoying the outdoors this summer!
