a message from senior pastor, Jacob Heine

Last month we looked at having a stable structure as we continue to do the work of living out our Guiding Statement -

We need a stable structure. Four walls. Four corners. Four pillars on which to build and stand.

In the months ahead, we will take the opportunity to explore a little bit what each of these pillars look like, why they are important and how they work together. Our activities and programming all finding their basis and grounding in these pillars.

Grief at Christmas...

a message from our Parish Nurse Pat Schultz, RN

"Tears do not reflect a lack of faith. Tears are a gift from God to wash away the deep pain of loss." Rev 21:4

We all understand that Christmas—and many other major holidays or days of celebration—can feel especially heavy for those who are grieving. The familiar rhythms of the season often stir deep emotions. The **three C's of grief** offer a gentle framework for navigating these tender moments.

The Three C's of Grief

- 1) Choose Make intentional choices about how you spend your time and whom you spend it with. Choose what feels most comfortable, supportive, and safe for you. Remember: it's perfectly okay to follow your usual Christmas traditions, and it's equally okay to make different choices this year.
- **2) Connect** Connection provides support, validation, and a sense of belonging. Stay in touch with others, especially during difficult times such as birthdays, anniversaries, and holidays. Even small moments of connection can bring comfort.
- **3)** Communicate Be honest with yourself and others about what you're experiencing and what you need. Clear communication allows those who care about you to offer meaningful support. You can also express your emotions in other ways—through music, art, or writing—whether you choose to share them or keep them private.
