a message from senior pastor, Jacob Heine

The earth was without form and void, and darkness was over the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the waters. Genesis 1:2

In Genesis 1:2 we translate it as "Formless and void." In our modern language we would say "Chaos."

Things seem to feel like chaos lately, at least to me. There is so much happening in the world. Watching the news, we see things happening in Israel and the Middle East. Ukraine and Russia continue to be at war. China and Taiwan are always staring each other down. North Korea is constantly an unknown threat. There are earthquakes and climate changes affecting the world.

Closer to home we have fires, blizzards, storms, and dust storms. There is a lot of change happening in the Federal Government that we all each day wait to see what the next change will be. And locally, we wonder which road will be under construction next and if the potholes will be taken care of before they do too much damage to our vehicles.

And in my own life, I have taken 6 trips since the beginning of the year, I have a Senior in High School that is getting ready to start college out of state in the Fall, I am preparing for the LCMS Youth Gathering this Summer, along with some vacation time and making it to other family items and events.

I know you are the same. You feel the same "chaos" in your own life and your own ways. Life continues to move faster and faster, and the amount of items we all have to juggle seems to continue to increase.

Genesis 1 offers us the perfect response for us in the midst of the chaos of life. *Then God said, "Let there be light," and there was light*. (Genesis 1:3)

In the middle of the chaos, God speaks! That is the first thing we note happens after we hear in Scripture that things are chaos. God speaks, so we can hear him. On the Mount of Transfiguration, in the midst of the chaos of Moses and Elijah, Jesus becoming dazzling bright, the voice of the Father speaks. "This is my Son, my Chosen One; listen to him!" (Luke 9:35).

Life is chaotic. There is so much happening and so many things that can distract us from the important and amazing gifts of God that He pours out for us in the Son, Christ Jesus. In the midst of the chaos, the most important things we can do is stop and hear God speak to us. Listen to the Son speak words of comfort and life. This gives us the opportunity to move back out into the world with the amount of things we have to juggle, and the Word of God dwelling within us.

Let me encourage you, therefore, not to miss a service this Holy Week. From Palm Sunday to Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday we will once again hear God speak into the chaos. He will fill us with the Word of life so as we live each day we can proclaim the praises of the One who speaks in the chaos. I can't wait to see you all Holy Week and invite a friend as well who needs to hear God in the middle of their chaos as well!


APRIL 17 | **Maundy Thursday** Recalls the night Jesus shared a Passover meal with his disciples.

5:00pm Worship - Traditional-style service with Holy Communion. **7:00pm Worship** - Traditional-style worship ends with the stripping of the altar; special music by the choir. Students who completed preparation classes will take their First Communion.



APRIL 18 | Good Friday We remember Jesus' suffering and death which led to victory over sin.

12:00 noon Worship – This 'Tre Ore' traditional-style service follows the seven last words from the cross.
7:30pm Worship – The Service of Darkness (Tenebrae) takes us to the most solemn moment on Calvary through Scripture, message, hymns, and powerful choir selections... ending in darkness and silence.



APRIL 20 | Easter Sunday Celebrate Jesus' resurrection as God has defeated the power of evil and death. Holy Communion will be celebrated at all services. Consider coming to Sunrise + another worship for the complete Easter story!

6:30am Sunrise Service - This service is all about the mystery of the resurrection. The congregation gathers in the lobby in darkness before entering the sanctuary, as we encounter the empty tomb and hear the message that "He Is Risen!"

8:00 & 9:30am Traditional – (Note: Change of worship times. No 12:15 service this day). Worship with a powerful message, triumphant hymns, joyous selections by Alleluia Ringers and the Choir, with brass & organ.
11:00am Modern – (Note: Time change) Celebrate the resurrection with a victorious message and uplifting contemporary songs featuring the Praise Team, Alleluia!

February 2025

- Total donations for the month were \$105,545 and expenses were \$99,745 resulting in a net positive balance for the month of \$5,800.
- Year to date donations are \$191,460 and expenses are \$207,075 resulting in a net year to date negative balance of \$15,616.
- Donations for the month were \$941 higher than 2024 and year to date donations are \$32,249 higher than 2024.

LIFELINE WOMEN'S RESOURCE CENTER ...

a message from our Parish Nurse Pat Schultz, RN

Topeka, Shawnee County, the State of Kansas, this is where we live. And most of us, at least most of the time, have "the things we need." But what happens when something changes in our life? Or we know someone who is going through a difficult time and could benefit from someone, an organization, a professionally-trained support system to help "walk with us" through the situation? I want to share some information about a resource I recently discovered. I joined other parish nurses for a District Parish Nurse gathering put together by our District Parish Nurse Representative, Mary Hume. We visited the Lifeline Women's Resource Center, located at 2041 SW McAlister Ave. right next door to the Baskin Robbins ice cream store on 21st street. Upon visiting this center and hearing of the many wonderful things they have to offer our community, I want to help spread the word about the great work they do. In fact, one thing they mentioned is that word of mouth is their best advertiser.

Lifeline Women's Resource Center (Lifeline WRC) offers many pregnancy services. These FREE services include:

- **Pregnancy Testing**—Lifeline WRC can provide you with a free, lab-quality urine test. Having confirmation of your pregnancy is the first step in making a plan moving forward for you and your baby.
- Limited Obstetric Ultrasound—Lifeline WRC can provide a free, limited initial ultrasound to confirm the viability of your pregnancy and determine how far along you are in your pregnancy. Their team will then be able to help connect you with prenatal care to ensure you and your baby are well cared for.
- Counseling Options—They offer counseling to women walking through difficult decisions and the choices they face. Lifeline WRC can help you process what each of these decisions will look like in the short and long term.

Lifeline WRC also offers other services, including **Parent Mentoring**—Signing up for the Parent Mentoring program allows you to have a mentor to encourage and walk alongside you in your parenting journey. Meeting with a parent mentor may help you feel more confident in your skills as a parent. **Insurance Enrollment**—As a qualified entity, Lifeline WRC can assist pregnant women in applying for presumptive eligibility and Medicaid to receive medical care.

As a small group of Parish Nurses, we visited with one of the three RNs who volunteer at Lifeline WRC. The nurses are trained to perform the limited obstetric ultrasounds and, because they are required to perform a set number of these scans to maintain licensure, they are willing and eager to perform free scans for women who are less than 27 weeks pregnant. Family members and/or friends are welcome to be present and see the baby's images in real time.

Lifeline WRC also has a Care Closet that provides different resources for their clients. Items in the Care Closet include

diapers, bottles, formula, clothes for children from NB to 5T, maternity clothes, hygiene items for moms, breast pumps, and blankets. I even saw some hand-made, quilted baby blankets. These items are given to their clients at no cost.

Other impressive information about Lifeline WRC includes:

- 1. Staff members share the love of Jesus and pray with clients, with some clients making the decision to accept Jesus as their Savior.
- 2. Every morning the staff share a bible study via zoom with other Lifeline WRC offices in Kansas.
- 3. The Center has lots of helpful information on local resources for clients. This information includes, but is not limited to, the abortion pill reversal, parenting classes, adoption, and post abortion support groups.
- 4. The Center runs solely on donations. They receive no government funding.

Lifeline WRC offers honest, factual information and resources for women who find themselves searching for pregnancy support. You can call or text Lifeline WRC at 785-249-6130. You can email them at LWRC@LIFELINECHILD.ORG. This website's home page is captioned, "Bringing Gospel hope to vulnerable children. Lifeline is here to support you as you discern how the Lord is leading you to care for vulnerable children." This is the heart of their mission. And of course, you can drop in at 2041 SW McAlister Avenue.
